Plan 1: Fixing Our Failing Schools

It is unacceptable that the three Primary Schools in our district have been neglected by the current area representative and saw no work done during the last school repair program.

Our Commitment:

We will ensure the proper maintenance of all primary schools in the district. Our children deserve safe, modern, and high-quality learning environments.

Plan 2: Tackling Unemployment and Lack of Opportunity
