



Highlights of PNM Accomplishments



ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT & FINANCE

- Increased Tobago's GDP from \$900M to \$1.7B (2001–2021).
- Created over 10,000 jobs; unemployment reduced from 13% to under 5%.
- Increased tertiary education share of labour force from 7% to 30%.
- Secured Tobago's first \$164M bond for capital projects.
- Enterprise Assistance Fund: millions invested in Tobago entrepreneurs; additional equity investment via Venture Capital.
- REACH Programme and BDU financing provided grants/loans to thousands of small businesses.
- COVID-19 economic support: \$50M to hotel industry, \$10M liquidity support for Credit Unions.
- Business development strengthened through partnerships with exportTT.
- Development of Cove Eco-Industrial and Business Park; provision of land and factory shells through E-IDCOT.
- Restructuring and modernization of Studley Park Quarry; procurement of new equipment; recommissioning of Barbados Bay Jetty for aggregate export.
- Commissioning of the APT James and Buccoo Reef fast ferries to boost domestic tourism and commerce.
- Construction of micro malls at Signal Hill, Calder Hall, Argyle, and Charlotteville.

AGRICULTURE & FOOD SECURITY

- Construction and rehabilitation of agricultural access roads across Tobago.
- Introduction of Home Garden Initiative, Eat Local Campaign and farmer-support programs.
- Establishment of YAPA program, providing training to hundreds of young farmers.
- Tobago Cassava Products, Fish Processing Company, Cold Storage Facility—now the Tobago Agribusiness Development Company.
- Launch of the Farmland Development Programme to expand food production.
- Goldsborough Water Irrigation Project commissioned.
- Support for farmers and beekeepers, land clearing assistance, seedlings distribution, and
- COVID agricultural relief.

Fisheries

- Modern fishing facilities constructed at Delaford, Castara, Charlotteville, Mt Irvine, Studley Park, Lambeau, and other communities.
 - Acquisition of the Capital of Paradise vessel and deep-sea fishing training for crews.
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- Incentives and other support for fishermen.
- Construction of several jetties.

INFRASTRUCTURE, ROADS & TRANSPORTATION

Roads & Bridges

- Construction/upgrading of major link roads: L'Anse Fourmi-Charlotteville, Spring Garden, Mason Hall-Les Coteaux, Windward Road, Northside Road, Lambeau Main Road, Arnos Vale, Daniel Trace, Rockly Vale-Providence, Stumpy Bypass, etc.
- Island-wide drainage upgrades, retaining walls, slipper drains.
- Claude Noel Highway Rehabilitation (Phase I).
- Thompson River Bridge commissioned.
- Installation of traffic lights at Shirvan, Buccoo/Mt Irvine, Orange Hill, Rockley Vale/Bacolet.
- Roundabouts constructed at Auchenskeoch, Shaw Park & Signal Hill.

Transport & Public Utilities

- Commissioning of Southwest Tobago Wastewater Treatment Plant.
- Desilting of Hillsborough Dam
- Drilling of wells and other projects to enhance water delivery.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT, PUBLIC FACILITIES & RECREATION

Community Centers & Multipurpose Spaces

- Construction of Buccoo Integrated Facility.

Youth Facilities

- 7 Y-Zones constructed (Plymouth, Mason Hall, Calder Hall and others).
- Several youth centers established.

Recreational Spaces

- 24 Hard Courts (21 with lights).
- 19 Lighted Playing Fields, including engineering transformation at Moriah.
- Several recreation grounds constructed/upgraded across Tobago.
- Community swimming pools at Courland & Kendall.
- Shopping and public-use facilities built at Plymouth, Calder Hall and Argyle (mall facilities).
- Charlotteville Library and Charlotteville Mall Facility constructed.

Markets

- New Scarborough Market commissioned.

HOUSING & LAND DEVELOPMENT

- Housing estates constructed at Roxborough, Castara, Blenheim, Belle Garden and Adventure.

EDUCATION & HUMAN CAPITAL

Schools
